Activity Menu for CARING

Due March 2nd

Grades K/1=1 activity ~ Grades 2/3=2 activities ~ Grades 4/5= 3 activities



1. Caring Book Review: Go to the library and check out a book that discusses **caring**. Write a review about the book answering the following questions:

- What is the title/ author?
- What is the book about?
 - Kindergarten/1st Grade: Draw a picture of the book you read about being caring.
 - 2nd/3rd Grade: Draw a picture of a character doing something that either WAS or WAS NOT being caring.
 - 4th/5th Grade: Write 3-5 sentences explaining something that WAS or WAS NOT being caring in the story. You may also draw a picture to add to your explanation.

Examples of Books about Caring

- Don't Worry Bear
- Hurty Feelings
- If Everybody Did
- Those Shoes
- The Giving Tree
- Alley Oops

2. Write a thank you note to someone in your community (school, neighborhood, etc.) who did something very CARING. Or, write a thank you note to a historical figure to thank him or her for what she did.

3. Imagine If...: Write a paragraph of 3-5 sentences or draw a picture to show how the world would be different if more people showed that they are caring--caring toward one another, their communities, the environment, or in any other way!

4. News Flash: Cut out a newspaper or magazine article about a person who showed caring--caring toward other people, animals, the environment, or in any other way. Write 3-5 sentences to summarize what they did to demonstrate caring.

5. Make a Collage: Find at least five pictures (in newspapers, magazines, etc) of people showing acts of caring. Write the word 'Caring' somewhere on the page and make a collage with the pictures. Can't find examples? Draw your own!

6. Character Detective: While driving or walking through your neighborhood, look for examples of people showing acts of caring in the community. Draw a picture of what you saw that was caring (Grades K-1) and write 2-3 sentences about what was happening (Grades 2-5).

7. Make a T-Chart: On one side of a T-chart, make a list of the people that show you they care about YOU and write or draw what they do to show they care. On the other side of the T-chart, write or draw what you do to show you care about THEM. Include at least 3 people.

8. Social Media Campaign: Find examples of people being **caring** on social media. For example, find a project or campaign that someone has used social media to promote and support their cause! Print a flyer or make a poster to help promote the cause!
